Yes, it can be hard for former prisoners to get a job:

- **Unemployment**

Formerly incarcerated people have a higher unemployment rate than the general population, with an average unemployment rate of 27%

- **Skills**

Many ex-prisoners lack basic skills, such as literacy, which can make it difficult to understand job ads, fill out applications, or write business letters

- **Criminal record**

Ex-offenders may not qualify for certain jobs because of their criminal record

- **Discrimination**

Parolees may face discrimination due to the stigma of having been in prison

- **Legal liability**

Employers may refuse to hire ex-offenders because of legal liability issues

However, it's not impossible to find a job. One effective job search strategy is to connect with your local Career Center and search for jobs you are qualified for.
